

GENERAL SAFETY- AND HEALTH REQUIREMENTS:

The equipment and delivery should:

- Comply with the applicable Belgian laws and registrations regarding safety and health at work.
- Fulfill the conditions in regard to safety and hygiene to meet the objective resulting from a dynamic risk control system as proposed in article 3 of the KB of 27 March 1998 concerning the welfare policy

See Codex about the well being at work, Title I, Chapter III, Division II, Article 3. This requirement implies that in regard to the equipment all necessary measures are taken for the well being of the people involved in a systematic an objectively justified way taking into account the development of the technique.

- Include the instructions needed for safe operations, service, maintenance and inspection, preferable in Dutch and if not available in English.
- Complete with a CE-marking.

SPECIFIC SAFETY- AND HEALTH REQUIREMENTS:European guideline / CE-marking**1. General:**

In any case the delivered equipment should be in compliance with all the applied regulations of the European guidelines or their conversion to the national right, such as:

- The guideline for machine safety 98/37/EG (as converted through 98/79/EG),
- The guideline for low tension 73/23/EEG as converted through 93/68/EEG,
- The guideline for EMC 89/336/EEG, amendments 93/31/EEG and 93/68/EEG,
- ...

The declaration of conformity (type II-A) to the guidelines concerned should be delivered at least with the delivery of the equipment, in an official language of Belgium, preferable in Dutch (if not available, in English).

2. Special case for machines to be build in or assembled

In case the delivery concerns a machine as referred to in the machine guideline, that can not work independently or is intended for installation or assembly and for which for this reason no compliance to enclosure II.A. of the machine guideline can be delivered, the supplier must at least provide upon delivery:

SAFETY REQUIREMENTS UPON ORDERING TECHNICAL EQUIPMENT

- A statement type II-B that confirms in an explicit way the compliance with all relevant fundamental requirements of the machine guideline that are independent from the fact of the installation or assembly.
- The instructions according the rules of the machine guideline (as for a machine with CE-marking), that indicates at least the correct operating limits and appropriate instructions for installation and/or assembly.
- A technical construction file kept at the disposal on the same way as a machine with a declaration of type II-A.

3. Special case for safety components that are brought on the market separately

The supplier needs to act in a similar way as mentioned under part 2 above. De declaration of conformity shall be of the type II-C.

Parts or aspects of equipment which aren't covered by the CE- marking will:

- Comply with the applicable "minimum requirements for equipment" and the other statutory Belgian requirements with respect to their view and building.
- Be delivered with a document that states the compliance with the preceding requirement.
- Be accompanied by instructions of working, operation, maintenance and inspection, for safety and health by their use.

SPECIAL SAFETY REQUIREMENTS FOR THIS ORDER:

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Upon delivery the supplier should hand over a document in which he certifies the compliance of these **special**, upon order stipulated requirements in regard to safety and hygiene.

The equipment that doesn't comply with all the preceding described requirements, can be a source of discussion, whereby the modalities of payment can change.
